3. Which specialist manufacturer ended up in a legal battle with the Ford Motor Company over the use of the Sierra name during the early 1980s? **Dutton**
4. What name was used for the secret 1940s project to develop the small car that would eventually be launched as the Morris Minor in 1948? **Mosquito**
5. MG is a famous marque. What does MG actually stand for? **Morris Garages**
6. What was the first British production car with front disc brakes? **Triumph TR3 in 1956**
