5. Which company was the first to market a radial ply tyre? **Michelin in the late 1940s.**
6. In 1964 actor Steve McQueen competed for the USA in which international motor sport event? **International Six Day Trial (ISDT)**
7. What was the first production car with fuel-injection? **Mercedes 300SL in 1954**
8. Only one person has won World Championship titles on both two and four wheels. Who? **John Surtees.**
9. Between 1973 and 1977 Ted Simon rode a 500cc Triumph Tiger 100 around the World. What was the name of the book he wrote about that journey? **Jupiter's Travels**
10. Who is the only female racing driver to score points in the F1 Drivers World Championship? **Lella Lombardi. - Finished sixth in the 1975 Spanish Grand Prix. Race was stopped after a tragic accident and only half points were awarded.**
