Who was it? **Graham Hill. World Champion: 1962 & 1968 , Indy 500: 1966, Le Mans: 1972. Some people include the Monaco Grand Prix in the 'triple crown' instead of the World Championship, in which case the answer remains the same as Hill won at Monaco on five occasions between 1963 and 1969.**
2. By what name was the Lotus 46 better known? **Lotus Europa**
3. Which racing motorcyclist is known to his fans as 'The Doctor'? **Valentino Rossi**
4. ADO16 was the drawing office project code number for one of the best selling cars of the 1960s. Which one? **The BMC (Austin, Morris, MG etc.) 1100 and 1300 of which over 2.3 million were built.**
5. What was the name of Bo and Luke Duke's 1969 Dodge Charger in the TV show 'The Dukes of Hazard'? **The General Lee.**
6. In which year was the driving test introduced to Britain? **1935**
7. Who was the first manufacturer to use laminated safety glass for car windscreens? **Ford, in the 1920s.**
8. Which iconic 1970s World Champion appeared in TV advertising for Brut 33 aftershave along with Henry Cooper? **Barry Sheene.**
9. The name of the British sports car marque Marcos was derived from the names of its two founders. Who were they? **Jem Marsh and Frank Costin**
