



Attending the Beaulieu Autojumble from Europe – bringing goods with you to sell – requires full customs clearance (export and import) and import VAT to be paid.

Prepare in advance:

- You must have a valid GB EORI
- You must have a valid EORI in the country in which you reside
- Open an account with a customs agent – email customs@HAIRSINES.com
- All the items you bring must be listed on a packing list (backed up by receipts or invoices stating the age and origin)
- Decide how you will pay the import VAT (the agent can guide you)

When you're ready to import your goods:

- You'll need EU export clearance
- You'll need UK import clearance (import VAT becomes due)
- You'll need to travel on a freight ticket when carrying commercial goods, which requires a GMR (goods movement reference)
- You'll need to upload certain codes from your customs clearance to your Port Pass before you travel
