Palace House

This Victorian-styled country house is still home to the Montagu family. Costumed guides are on hand to share with you the history of the House and the generations who have lived here.

Beaulieu Abbey & Exhibition

Now largely a conserved ruin, you will find an exhibition on the history of the Abbey and the monks that lived and worked here. You are welcome to step inside the Abbey Church, this may be restricted due to services or functions.

Secret Army Exhibition

Discover Beaulieu's covert wartime role as a school for the Special Operations Executive and hear the stories of the agents who trained here during World II.

Grounds & Gardens

Discover a working Victorian Kitchen Garden, Flower Garden and enjoy a stroll along the Mill Pond as you explore the grounds.

On Screen Cars

An exhibition of cars from TV and Cinema.

Enjoy unlimited inclusive rides around the park on the open top Veteran Bus and Monorail. Stations for both are marked on the map.

Eat & Drink



At Buckler's Hard, just over 2 miles away, you'll see a beautifully preserved 18th century village on the now tranquil and picturesque banks of the Beaulieu River.

Once a hive of shipbuilding activity, providing warships for Nelson's Navy, Buckler's Hard is home to historic worker's cottages, beautiful scenery and a fascinating maritime museum Admiral Lord Nelson's favourite warship HMS Agamemnon, was built and launched here. Enjoy the peaceful riverside surroundings of the historic village and tour the reconstructed cottage interiors for a taste of 18th century life. Explore the museum to learn more about the history of the village and its residents, before taking a relaxing cruise on the Beaulieu River (seasonal), a Site of Special Scientific Interest.
